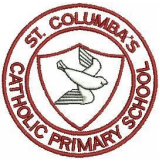
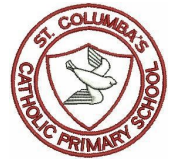

A word from the Headteacher

Last week really was a wonderful week! The school is now full of children, full of laughter and full of learning; just as it should be.

Thank you so much to all of those families that have supported school in getting us off to such a successful start.

Now that the first week has passed, I do need to remind families of the following school rules:

- It has always been important that your child arrives to school on time, however during these times it really is vital that they arrive at their allocated times.

When your child is late it causes huge disruption to the whole school. The school risk assessment states that the children need to stay in their allocated 'Bubble', so if your child is late, it means that the adults from their class have to leave the bubble to come outside and get your child. This is unfair on the adult but also on the class of children, who have been in school on time and are sitting ready to learn.

- There is an unusually large amount of children wearing trainers in school. Children may wear trainers on a PE day but must wear black school shoes when wearing their full school uniform. If you are struggling to buy your child new school shoes, please contact the school office as we may be able to support you in purchasing some.

As of Monday 15th March, if your child is wearing trainers you must provide them with a note explaining the reason for this and also when you will be in a position to buy them.

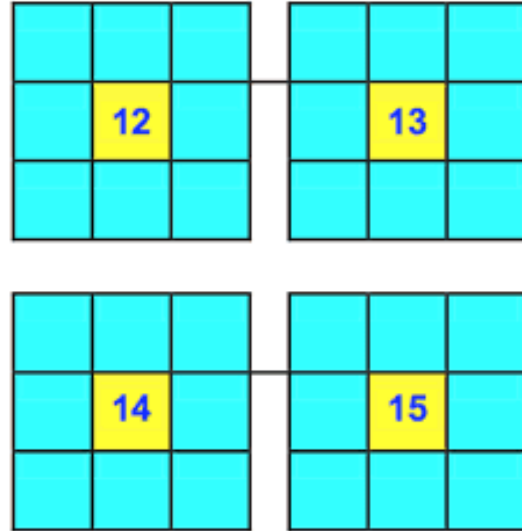
