

Nursery-Autumn 2020

Key learning - children will have opportunities to:

Personal, Social and Emotional Development - Making relationships, self-confidence and self-awareness, managing feelings and behaviour•

To be interested in others' play and to start to join in. To seek out others to share experiences. To show affection and concern for people who are special to them. To form a special friendship with another child. To initiate play with new friends. To behave in a friendly way, initiating conversations and forming good relationships with peers and familiar adults.

To play in a group, extending and elaborating play ideas, e.g. building up a role-play activity with other children. To select and use activities and resources with help. To enjoy responsibility of carrying out small tasks. To separate from main carer with support and encouragement from a familiar adult. To express own preferences and interests. To become more outgoing towards unfamiliar people and more confident in new social situations. To show understanding and cooperation with some boundaries and routines. To inhibit own actions/behaviours, e.g. stop themselves from doing something they shouldn't do. To begin to distract self when upset, e.g. by engaging in a new play activity. To begin to accept the needs of others and to take turns and share resources, sometimes with support from others.

Communication and Language - Listening and Attention, Understanding and Speaking.

To show interest in play with sounds, songs and rhymes. To listen to others one to one or in small groups. To listen to stories with increasing attention and recall. To join in with repeated refrains and anticipate key events in familiar stories. To develop understanding of 'who', 'what', 'where' in simple questions. To develop understanding of simple concepts (e.g. big/little). To show understanding of prepositions such as 'under', 'on top', 'behind' by carrying out an action or selecting correct picture. To respond to simple instructions, e.g. to get or put away an object. To hear and develop understanding of 'why' and 'how' questions. To learn new words very rapidly, through interesting topics and to have opportunities to use them when communicating. To begin to use more complex sentences to link thoughts (e.g. using and, because). To use talk to connect ideas, explain what is happening and anticipate what might happen next, as well as to recall and relive past experiences.
