How you can help at home?

You can help at home by ensuring knowledge organisers are utilised. We will be sending home a new knowledge organiser for each History, Geography and Science topic taught. On it you will find key vocabulary, which children will be assessed on, as well as enquiry questions to be investigated and key facts to be remembered. You can also help at home by ensuring children are reading at home. We collect reading book bags in on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

<u>Homework:</u> Children will be set homework, in line with our school homework policy, each Monday, Wednesday and Friday. As a school, we have purchased SATS Companion. All children have login details so that they can access work set online for them. We also encourage the use of Reading Plus and TTRS at home too. Children will also get sent home a spelling list each week based on a spelling rule taught in class. Spelling tests will be carried out each Monday.

English

Each day, children will engage in 30 minute spelling/grammar sessions. These sessions will inform spelling lists which will be sent home for children to practise.

Reading will be taught daily, with our class novel to be covered this term being 'Holes'
Writing genres to be taught:

Letters and Freedom narrative
These will be taught through the 'Read to Write'
approach using the text 'Dream to Freedom'

<u>R.E.</u>

Children take part in daily acts of collective worship as well as weekly whole-school ones.

Science

Science is taught each week following the units of work outlined in the National Curriculum. Children will be taught unit specific vocabulary and assessed on both knowledge and scientific skills throughout each topic. This term we will be studying the following:

We follow 'Maths No Problem' which is based upon the Singapore approach to teaching Mathematics. Daily Maths lessons involve a 'Fluent in 5' session in which children are given the chance to refine the four number operations and apply to solve a problem.
