Nursery-Autumn Term Curriculum Map 2022

Key learning - children will have opportunities to:

Personal, Social and Emotional Development – To select and use activities and resources, with help when needed, in order to achieve a self chosen goal or one that is suggested to them. To develop their sense of responsibility and membership of a community. To become more outgoing with unfamiliar people in the safe context of their setting. To show more confidence in new social situations. To play with one or more other children, extending and elaborating play ideas. To find solutions to conflicts and rivalries through talk. For example, accepting that not everyone can be the main character in a game and suggesting other ideas. To increasingly follow rules, understand why they are important and remember them without prompts. To develop appropriate ways of being assertive. To talk about their feelings using words like happy, sad, angry or worried. To understand how others might be feeling. To be increasingly independent in meeting own care needs: teeth, toilet, washing and drying hands. To make healthy choices about food, drink, activity and toothbrushing.

Communication and Language -

To enjoy listening to longer stories and remember much of what happens. To pay attention to more than one thing at a time. To use a wider range of vocabulary. To understand a question or instruction with two parts. To understand questions beginning with 'why.' To sing a large repertoire of songs, know many rhymes, be able to talk about familiar books and be able to tell a long story. To develop their communication, sometimes struggling with tenses e.g. 'he runned.' To develop pronunciation sometimes struggling with sounds like: r,j, th, ch and sh or longer words e.g. hippopotamus. To use longer sentences of 4 to 6 words. To be able to express a point of view and to debate when they disagree with an adult or a friend using words as well as actions. To start a conversation with an adult or a friend and continue it for many turns. To use talk to organise themselves and their play e.g. "Let's go on a bus. You sit there, I'll be the driver."

<u>How you can help at home?</u> Please encourage your child to develop a love of books, both fiction and non-fiction as this helps feed their imaginations, which helps with their role play, reading and writing. Read stories to them at bedtime, sing songs and nursery rhymes. Encourage them to mark make pretend letters/ cards / messages and to count objects and practise making marks to represent numbers in play e.g. keeping a tally of a score. Encourage your child to spot familiar signs and logos when your are out and about. Celebrate independence e.g. when your child dresses / puts on coats or shoes independently.

<u>Class Dojo and Tapestry</u>: Both our online platforms are a window into your child's experience at school. We love it when you share observations from home with us and they give important insights into your child's development which help us tailor the learning experiences they need.

Homework: In Nursery we send home a Share book every Friday with a journal where your child can illustrate the story and you can make any observations about your time reading together. Your child will also have the chance to choose books from our Reading Rainbow scheme. We will try our best to let them choose a new book on the day they return it.
