War in Israel and Gaza

This week Pope Francis once again called for peace in Israel and Gaza. In his General Audience in Rome he particularly made an appeal for the release of Israeli hostages held by Hamas and the entry of humanitarian aid to be allowed in Gaza. He also made a specific call for peace in Ukraine too lest we forget the many other places where war and violence impact especially on the poorest and vulnerable people. The Christian communities in Israel and Palestine often get caught in the struggle of Israeli and Jewish viewpoints on one hand and Palestinian and Muslim views on the other. Cardinal Pizzaballa the Catholic Patriarch of Jerusalem last wrote to his whole diocese "My conscience and moral duty require me to state clearly that what happened on October 7th in southern Israel is in no way permissible and we cannot but condemn it. There is no reason for such an atrocity. Yes, we have a duty to state this and to denounce it. The use of violence is not compatible with the Gospel, and it does not lead to peace. The life of every human person has equal dignity before God, who created us all in His image.

The same conscience, however, with a great burden on my heart, leads me to state with equal clarity today that this new cycle of violence has brought to Gaza over five thousand deaths, including many women and children, tens of thousands of wounded, neighbourhoods razed to the ground, lack of medicine, lack of water and of basic necessities for over two million people. These are tragedies that cannot be understood and which we have a duty to denounce and condemn unreservedly. The continuous heavy bombardment that has been pounding Gaza for days will only cause more death and destruction and will only increase hatred and resentment. It will not solve any problem, but rather create new ones. It is time to stop this war, this senseless violence."

He asked the Christians of the Holy Land to turn to the model of Jesus in the Gospels and be courageous witnesses for peace.. We continue to support them in our own prayers.

Inauguration of the Co-Cathedral on the the Isle of Man

Following the announcement in September, Saint Mary of the Isle Church, Douglas, Isle of Man will be elevated to cathedral status on Friday 3rd November at 12 noon.

The island will welcome the Archbishop of Liverpool, Malcolm McMahon OP, the Apostolic Nuncio to Great Britain, Archbishop Miguel Maury Buendía, Canons of the Metropolitan Cathedral and bishops from across England and Wales.

Dignitaries from the Manx Government and from Douglas City Council will attend as well as ecumenical partners and parishioners from across the island.

During the ceremony the Apostolic Nuncio will read a decree from Pope Francis elevating the Church to the status of cathedral and will install Archbishop Malcolm in his chair, or cathedra, which the name cathedral comes from.


