When visiting Fr Anthony in Ghana, his family home is right next to the sea and you can see hundreds of colourful fishing boats going out and returning every day, and some have religious quotes such as 'Praise the Lord' or a bible verse painted on the side. It looks like hard work to make a living like than and those who enjoy fishing as a hobby here at home probably have much more patience than I have. I must admit I do like the result of the fishers labours. Cod, battered from the chippy, sea bass, pan fried in a restaurant of freshly caught fish, grilled on the seashore in Ghana or Galilee. I am making myself hungry just thinking about it - and I am writing this on a Friday!

Jesus called his first followers at the side of the Sea of Galilee, Fishermen mending their nets but then asked to move and change. Initially I am not sure whether I think that the skills of fishermen are what is needed as proclaimers of the Good News, bringing this to anyone who will listen.
