





How you can help at home? Please encourage your child to develop a love of books, both fiction and non-fiction as this helps feed their imaginations, which helps with their role play, reading and writing. Read stories to them at bedtime, sing songs and nursery rhymes. Encourage them to write their full names and simple sentences. Also to count objects and practise adding and subtracting objects/numbers. Encourage independence and sharing their experiences from school. Come along to workshops and 'Stay and Learn' events.

Homework: This is given out each Friday for Maths and English work. Throughout the term homework relating to Topic work and R.E. work may also be given out. Home reading books are changed on a Friday. Reading Rainbow books are changed weekly or on request.

English

Main books - The Extraordinary Gardener. The Storm whale. Non fiction -lifecycles of caterpillars and chicks, tadpoles

To link sounds to letters, segment and blend words together. Writing words and simple sentences. Forming

Mathematics

Number: Have a deeper understanding of numbers to 10, including the composition of each number. Recall number bond facts. Number Patterns: Verbally count beyond 20, recognising patterns in number. Doubling and sharing.

Art and Design

To explore colour, texture, shape, form and space in 2D and 3D. To use their imagination in art and design, music, dance, imagination, role-play and stories.

P.E.

To develop gymnastic skills through travelling and taking weight on different body parts. To create dances and follow dance routines linked to themes. Using equipment safely

History

Children talk about family customs and events. They will learn about kings and queens, Princes and Princesses through story and events.

R.E.
