

Parental Home-School Agreement

Parents and carers sign the school's Home-School Agreement, a statement of partnership. The agreement sets out the parent and carers' duty to support the school's Positive Behaviour Policy which is available on the school website.

Our Behaviour Steps

Occasionally, children need support to correct their behaviour. This table shows how we respond when children act in ways that aren't okay, so you can see how we support them and keep everyone ready to learn, respectful and safe.

A Reminder to make a better choice Small mistakes like Swinging on your chair Talking when someone else is talking Not following instructions Pushing in line or rough play	2	You might ➤ Be given a quiet reminder ➤ Be given a warning or signal from an adult ➤ Be given help you get back on track

Our Rewards

We believe in celebrating and rewarding children's achievements, efforts, and positive attitudes to encourage a love of learning and personal growth. Rewards include:

Headteacher's Award for outstanding achievements or positive behaviours.

Fruits of the Holy Spirit Awards recognise positive moral and Christian values.

House Points awarded for positive behaviour, effort, achievement, teamwork, or contributions to the school community.

Recognition Board and Class Rewards to celebrate children's achievements in class.

Star of the Week honours outstanding achievements and effort in lessons.

English Expert and **Maths Magician Awards** celebrate those who show a love of learning.

Magical Mission Maker is awarded for personal growth.

Attendance Recognition Award celebrates children and families who make great efforts to attend school consistently.
